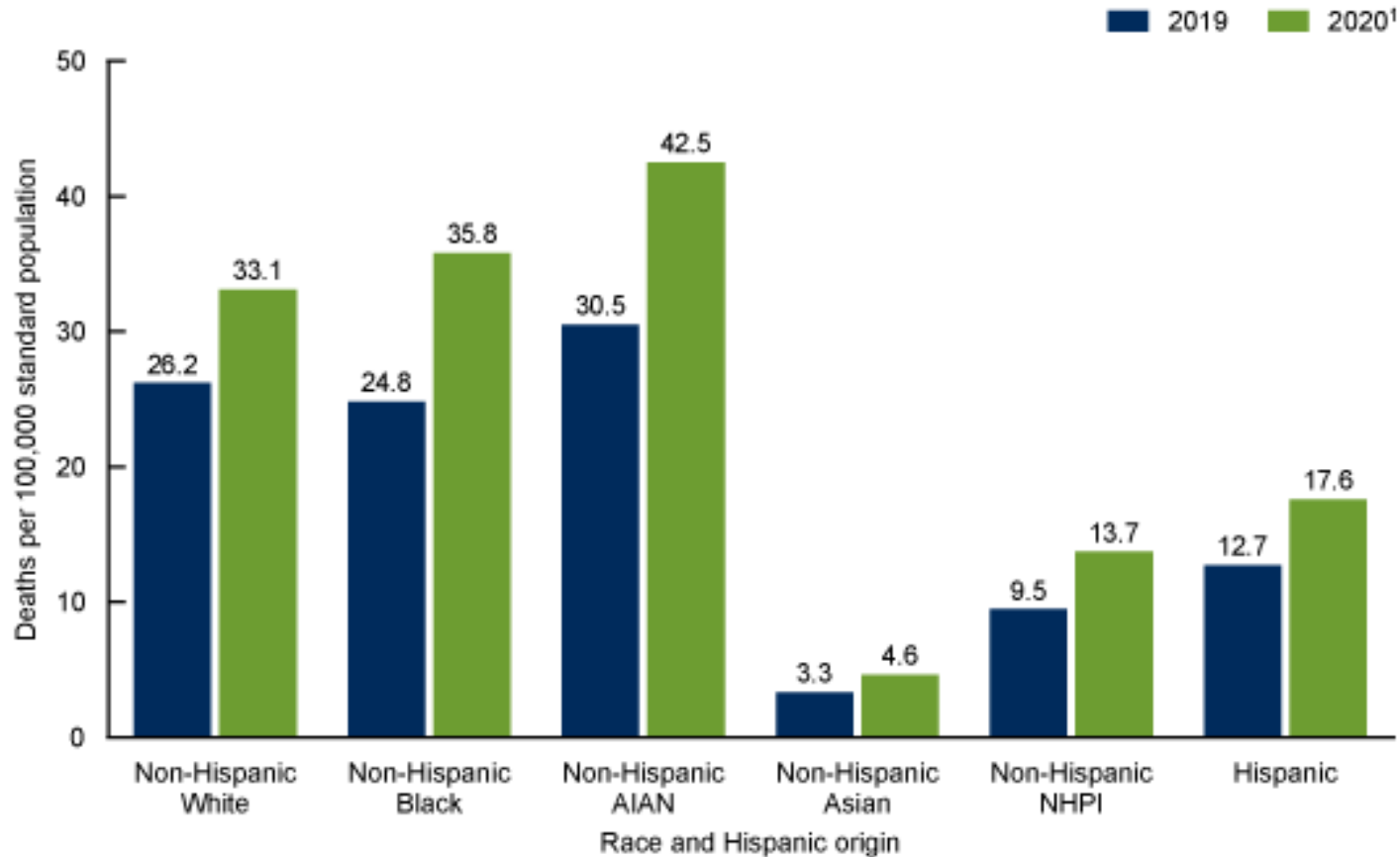

# Racial disparities in overdose death

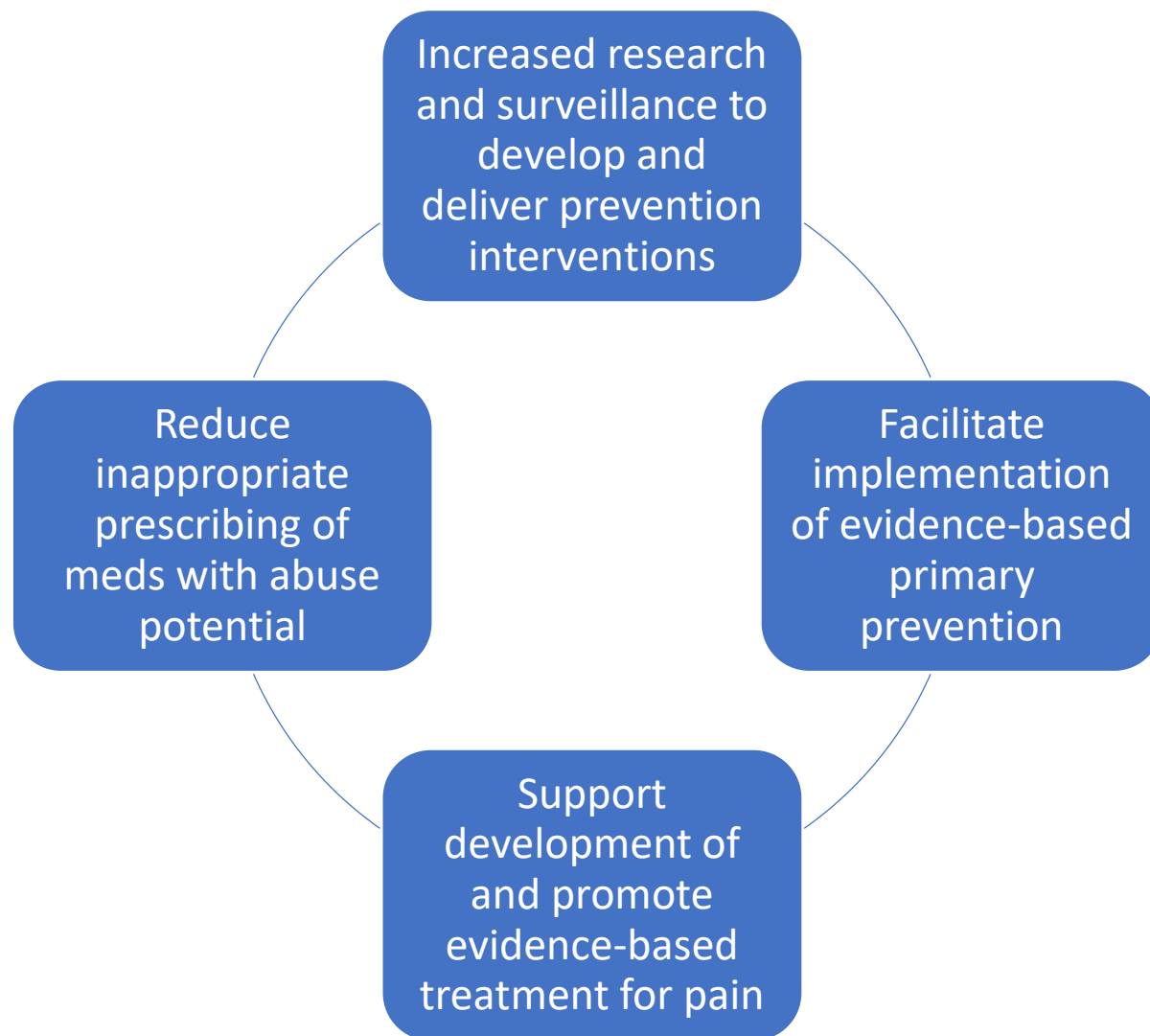


Age-adjusted drug overdose death rates, by race and Hispanic origin: United states, 2019 and 2020.

## Fentanyl Facts

- Fentanyl is 50 to 100 times more potent than heroin and morphine. Fentanyl is the most common drug involved in overdose deaths.
- Fentanyl is being mixed with other drugs, such as heroin, methamphetamine, cocaine, cannabis and MDMA. A person who uses drugs can be unaware that a powder, a pill or any substance contains it.

This small amount of fentanyl can kill!

### NARCAN SAVES LIVES!

<p>Naloxone (Narcan) is a medicine that can be given to a person to reverse a fentanyl or any opioid overdose.</p>	<p>What are Fentanyl Test Strips? Fentanyl test strips are easy to use tests to see if your drugs have fentanyl in them.</p>	<p>Multiple naloxone (Narcan) doses - up to or 4-6 doses - might be necessary because of fentanyl's potency.</p>

## NALOXONE & FENTANYL

A fentanyl overdose **may** take additional doses of naloxone to reverse. An overdose depends on many factors, and a person's **tolerance** to opioids plays an important role.

Naloxone used on a fentanyl overdose works at the same speed as it would with other opioids. It will still take about **two minutes** for a dose of naloxone to work. Give another dose if you see no change after two minutes!



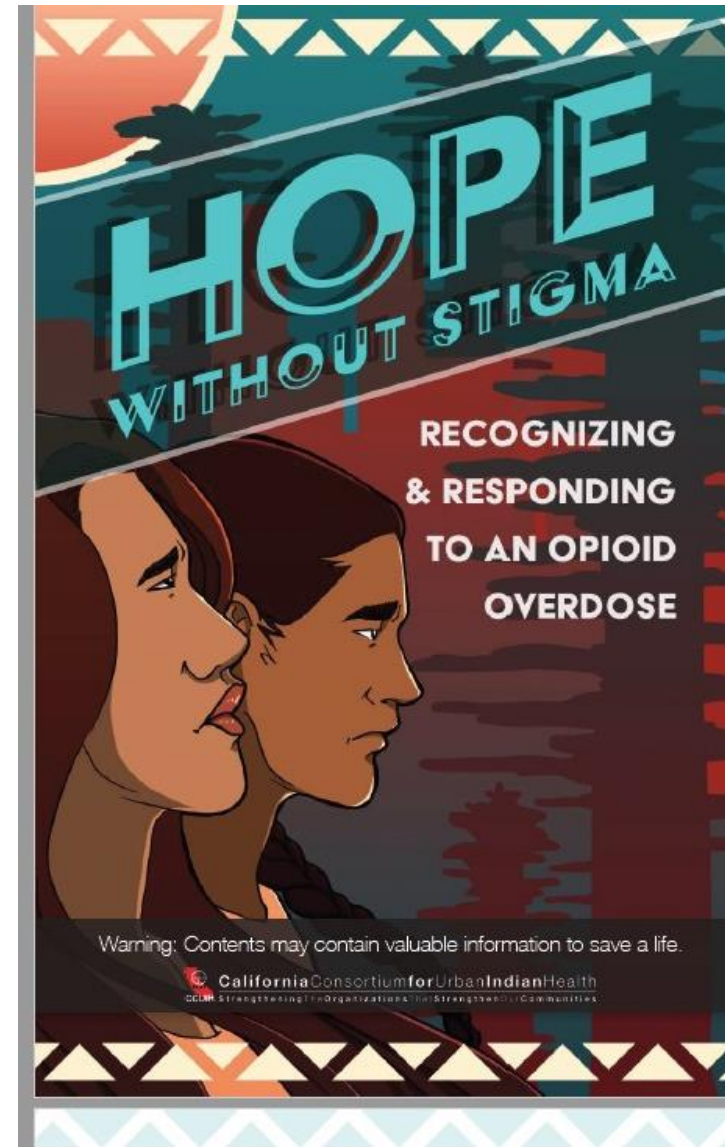

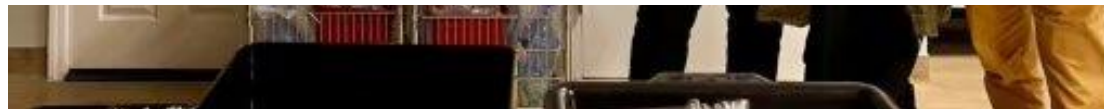


# New York City Safe Injection Site



## Overdose Prevention Centers Averted 59 Overdoses in First Three Weeks of Operation

December 21, 2021 — The Health Department today announced that, in the first three weeks of operation, staff at the two Overdose Prevention Centers (OPCs) in New York City, operated by OnPoint NYC, averted at least 59 overdoses to prevent injury and death. In the first three weeks of operation, the centers have been used more than 2,000 times.
