Training Description and Core Clinical Components:	The purpose of this one-hour web training is to provide participants with an overview of Project ECHO® clinics and Opioid Use Disorders. Topics will include the structure and purpose of Project ECHO® clinics; definitions of opioids and opioid intoxication; understanding the criteria for Opioid Use Disorder and the role primary care teams play in addressing the opioid epidemic. A case presentation will be included for discussion.
